A BEAUTIFUL SIGHT

The construction of the fence project at the entrance of Oakdale was completed in October 2009. Shortly thereafter, a reception was held for all who had contributed toward making this possible and our entrance inviting. A special thanks to Dr. and Mrs. John Canada for inspiring us with this project and also for their generous contribution. We are also grateful for Mr. and Mrs. Job Savage who also generously contributed to this enhancement of Oakdale Cemetery. However, it is with deep regret that Dr. Canada passed away shortly after the completed project.





In total there have been 143 new shrubs planted including azaleas, camellias, daylilies, hydrangeas and roses to extend the color throughout most of the year. Just after Thanksgiving 3,000 daffodils were planted along the shrub beds to give an outstanding show for the coming Spring. In late Spring the final addition of 200 perennials were planted consisting of black-eyed susans, purple coneflower, phlox and veronicas to fill in locations and compliment the new shrubbery.

AN EAGLE AND A BLUEBIRD

Recently some new additions have been added to various locations in the cemetery, bluebird houses. As part of an Eagle Scout Project, Eric Hunnicut and Troop 234 constructed and installed 10 bluebird houses. The design and information had come from one of our lot owners and avid bluebird advocate, Mr. Frank Symmes. Mr. Symmes continues his efforts with these new houses and monitors each new nests and fledglings.



A HISTORIC LANDMARK

A military stone was dedicated to honor the memory and career of Major James Reilly, last October. He was an artillerist and gallant hero of the Battle of Fort Fisher, January 15, 1865. Descendents, United Daughters of the Confederacy, Sons of Confederate Veterans, and the Military Order of the Stars and Bars all participated in this event. A full Confederate military salute was given by Confederate re-enactors from the 20th NC State Troops, Adams Battery, and the Fort Fisher gun crew. His grave can be found in Section H, Lot # 10.

TREEMENDOUS FRIENDS TO HAVE

Recently the Friends of Oakdale Cemetery have come to the aid of Oakdale in a treemendous way. This past winter the Friends of Oakdale funded a project for the pruning and removal of deadwood for nearly 300 dogwoods throughout the property. The project did not end there, twenty-three new dogwoods (6 ft plus) were purchased and planted by the cemetery staff where dogwoods have been removed over the years. This tremendous work still goes on, this Spring \$10,000 was contributed to aid in the removal and deadwood pruning of some of our grand oaks that have suffered from age and recent drought.

New Cremation Rules

Over the past ten years Oakdale Cemetery has experienced a dramatic rise in cremation. These past few years Oakdale has received 35% of its burials as cremation interments. With this growing number of cremation burials, the Board of Directors recently adopted new rules and regulations regarding cremation interments.
